This is the last newsletter for the Little Green Steps Western Australian pilot. With Lotterywest funding, the 12 month trial has been running since July 2012 in conjunction with three childcare centres in three Perth council areas. Read more about our achievements and next steps below...

Highlights from the Little Green Steps WA Pilot











The main purpose of the Little Green Steps pilot was to learn what type of support and resources are required by early childhood staff to engage children in sustainability behaviours, especially those linked to the Early Years Learning Framework. It was an opportunity to create networks that support sustainability education in the early years (particularly in Western Australia), trial new resources and find out how early childhood services are already incorporating sustainability.

The pilot focused on three Childcare Centres (Riverdale, Coolabaroo and Treasure Island), where children were engaged in hands-on sustainability activities with a particular focus on waste and recycling, worms, gardening and Australian animals.



The trial provided resources and professional learning for early years educators from the pilot centres and other services. Our workshops, *Day-to-Day Sustainability in Early Years Settings*, were well attended and we were thrilled to receive these comments from participants: "Fabulous way to network and learn", "Excellent ideas to adapt and adopt", "Really enjoyed how many of the concepts were actively workshopped with different tools", "I learnt that there is more to sustainability than I thought", "Made me think about work and home", "We need to have these presentations in the country areas", "A useful, cohesive introduction to sustainability in childcare", "Fantastic interactive sharing of knowledge!", "Inspirational!".



Our Next Steps

We have been excitedly planning the next phase of Little Green Steps in WA, but at the time of publication we are yet to confirm future funding and partnerships. While the pilot has focused on three childcare centres and their council areas in WA, we hope to expand the program to provide more opportunities and support across the state. To allow this, we plan to offer many more sustainability workshops, as well as membership to the program for a range of early years service providers.

Eat in Season

What's in season in Winter?

<u>Fruit:</u> apples, avocados, bananas, grapefruit, kiwi fruit, lemons, limes, mandarins, nashi pears, navel

oranges, paw paw, honeydew melons.

<u>Vegetables:</u> beetroot, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, Chinese vegetables, kale, lettuce, leeks, mushrooms, peas, potatoes, pumpkins, radishes, rhubarb, parsnips, silver beet, spinach, sweet potatoes, turnips.

What to Grow in Winter

In Perth's Mediterranean climate, it's time to plant asparagus, beetroot, broad beans, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, celery, lettuce, onions, peas, parsnip, potatoes, radishes, rhubarb,

shallots, silver beet, spinach, turnips, spring onions.



Starting Small

Even if you have a small garden, limited time, minimal experience or little funding, you can still involve children in growing plants and learning about where food comes

from. Children enjoy the responsibility of caring for plants, playing in soil and eating what they grow.

While Winter rains look after your patch outside, start growing vegetable seedlings in a warm place by an inside window. They'll be ready to plant into the garden in Spring.

Sunflowers grow quite quickly, and you are soon rewarded with large golden blooms. Plant seeds in Spring and Summer, and when the flowers finish you can collect the new seeds and store them to plant next time!

Little Green Steps- supporting Education for Sustainability in the early years

What is Sustainability?

Many participants on our Little Green Steps workshops commented that they didn't realise there was so much to sustainability! While most people associate sustainability with environmental outcomes, social and economic aspects are often overlooked.







In the workshops, the Australian Sustainable Schools Initiative WA Ecological Footprint and Social Handprint were used to help show the multiple aspects of sustainability, and their interconnectedness. As the participants discussed and expanded their understanding of sustainability, it helped highlight the range of sustainability actions that many were already doing in their early years service, and gave them a point to plan and grow from.

Due to the interests of the centres involved in the Little Green Steps pilot, and wanting to put our time in to exploring topics in depth, the resources and activities provided over the past 12 months have focused on only some aspects of sustainability. The chosen topics of waste, recycling, worms and gardens tied in well together. While looking at waste and recycling, Riverdale Childcare Centre found better use for their food scraps in a worm farm, which is generating liquid fertiliser to provide nutrients for their vegetable gardens. Involving children in growing plants also helps demonstrate the processes of decomposition, nutrient cycling and growth. And they enjoy taste-testing their produce too!

In time, Little Green Steps WA resources will be developed on other aspects of sustainability.

Plastic Free July

Did you know that virtually every piece of plastic ever made still exists in some form today?

Get ready for the Plastic Free July Challenge!

Can you cut your use of single-use plastic items for one day, one week or the whole month of July?

Every year, Australians send over 1.5 million tonnes of plastic packaging to landfill. The Plastic Free July Challenge aims to raise awareness of how much single-use plastic we consume every day. "Single-use" includes plastic shopping bags, plastic cups, straws, plastic packaging; essentially anything that's intended only to be used once and then sent to landfill.
